
Changing Permissions on Journal Six Database


If you normally log into your computer with an administrator account, you do not need to do the tasks outlined in this document. You are ready to start using Journal Six.

If you normally log into your computer with a user account, you will need to change the security permissions on the Journal Six database so that you can write to it. After you complete the tasks in this document, you are ready to start using Journal Six.


Use Windows Explorer to navigate to the C:\Program Files (x86)\JournalSixV5 folder (if you have a 64-bit system) or C:\Program Files\JournalSixV5 folder (if you have a 32-bit system.)




2. Right click on the **JournalSix** database file and choose properties. (If you have file extensions viewable, the name of the file is **JournalSix.sdf**.)



3. Click on the Security tab. Then click on Edit to change permissions.



- 4. If the User Access Control dialog box appears, provide the password for your Windows administrator account.
- 5. Select Users. Then click the **Allow** box for **Full Control**. Finally click OK.



6. You are done and ready to start using Journal Six. Enjoy.
